

CARE WHERE YOU NEED IT

Its five o'clock in the afternoon and your four month old has woken from his nap with a high fever. You know your family doctor's office is closed. Do you automatically think that you should head to the Emergency Room? There is a better solution!

The Walk-In Clinics at South Huron Hospital Association and Grand Bend Area Community Health Centre offer care for patients of all ages who need treatment for non-life threatening, acute illness.

South Huron Hospital Association in Exeter provides a clinic three hours per day, 364 days per year (closed Christmas Day).

Grand Bend Area CHC provides Walk-In Service every Saturday morning. Outside of that time, care is by calling for an appointment.

If you cannot get to your family doctor during their office hours, or if you don't have a family doctor, care will be provided at one of these clinics. Bring your health card. Common conditions treated at the Walk-In Clinics are: cuts, bites, minor burns, infections, earaches, nose and throat complaints, urinary problems.
